ELLEN VAN VOLKENBURG

Before 1912, the term "Puppeteer" did not exist in the English language. Ellen van Volkenburg, a director with the Chicago Little Theatre, needed a program credit for the actors she had trained to manipulate marionettes while speaking the text of "A Midsummer Night's Dream". Van Volkenberg coined this word at the dawn of the movement in puppetry that has brought us to the rich art form that is practiced today.

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
